Academic Excellence

Students are continually setting goals for unit learning objectives and reflecting on the progression toward those goals regularly.

Students and teachers are tracking student growth using Google Drive, so data can be updated at any time and easily shared with other teachers or parents.

Bi-monthly PLC meetings ensure that RTI data is constantly being examined and RTI instruction is changing based on a student's immediate needs.

Within the school district, Chandler's has been recognized as a leader in meeting our students' needs through the implementation of Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports. Live School is used at Chandler's to reinforce positive behavior and academic choices. Students are encouraged through Project Based Learning instruction to seek ways to make a difference for the surrounding community as well as outside our rural area.

Social Equity

After taking a 60-question interest survey, students can choose between 10 different classes based on their interests, which will culminate into Passion Projects.

Teachers work collaboratively to ensure students have one-to-one or small group experiences minimize gaps.

Ongoing district collaboration aids with social equity as common assessments are created and evaluated within the district.

Organizational Support

Middle school teachers collaborate with both 5th grade and 9th grade teachers to ensure smooth transitions during each part of the middle school experience.

Middle school teachers are committed to their growth as educators and refuse to stay stagnant in their teaching. Since our re-designation in 2016, middle school teachers have attended professional development in the following areas: Project Based Learning, Artisan Teacher, coding, Next Generation, KY Go Digital, KET, offerings through our educational cooperative, and many content- specific trainings offered at the regional, state, and national level.
