Developmental Responsiveness

Our school responds to the unique challenges our students face by looking for different ways to address students' physical, emotional, social, and educational needs.

- In the physical aspect, our campus enforces the sports-in-season concept implemented by the district. The special education program's caseworkers and curriculum specialists ensure that every student assessment, from weekly quizzes to benchmarks, offer the accommodations required for each student to meet a passing standard and ensure their success.

Social Equity

The campus provides every student with high quality teachers, effective instructional resources, and research-based learning opportunities. Teachers are highly qualified, evident by the teaching certificate issued by the State Board for Educator Certification, which every teacher is required to hold. Core area teachers use progress-monitoring charts to monitor the progress of all students.
