Developmental Responsiveness

We create a personalized environment that supports each scholar's intellectual, ethical, social, and physical development through extracurricular activities that support a variety of interests such as Athletics, Robotics, Band, etc.

B.L. Gray Jr. High provides access to comprehensive services to foster healthy physical, social, emotional and intellectual development of our scholars by training staff to recognize when scholars are having difficulties.

Counselors provide guidance lessons focused on age-appropriate topics, such as growth mindset, leadership, bullying prevention and other topics.

Scholars are provided with opportunities to develop citizenship skills, use the community as a classroom, and to engage with community in providing resources and support through programs such as Kids Helping Kids Campaign, Vannie E. Cook Toy Drive, and Heavenly Hats to name a few.

Social Equity

At B.L. Gray Jr. High, we recognize the importance of building meaningful relationships with our scholars as the first step toward laying the necessary foundation for successful learning to occur.

Our master schedule is created and implemented with special education student's needs and the needs of English learners in mind.

Units are formulated and delivered to highlight aspects from multiple cultures, such as, but not limited to, novel units, in association with nonfiction related current event articles that cultivate Hispanic Heritage Month and National American Indian Heritage Month.

We encourage and motivate each scholars' accomplishments through attendance celebrations and scholar-led parades down our hallways. We recognize a Rattler of the Month each six weeks who exemplifies good character and leadership qualities.

Organizational Support

We are a learning organization that establishes norms, structures and organizational arrangements to support and sustain our path towards excellence.
